Welcome



Join Hull City Supporters' Trust (HCST) in turning back time to create a unique and enduring tribute to the original 1906 Spion Kop End of Hull City's original ground. Lost to history in the 1965 British Railways summer excursion loop, football history ended at Hull City's original home ground as the railway loop created an oasis of nature.

But now, in the run-up to Hull City's 120th Anniversary, HCST have a unique opportunity to establish a permanent memorial, and to gain a National Lottery Heritage Fund grant, possibly to the tune of £500,000. A condition of the grant includes a 10% target of matched funding, so the not-for-profit HCST has to raise £50,000.

We are creating the Spion Kop 1906 Club to celebrate Hull's unique football heritage and to support this nationally important sporting passion project.

The UK's renowned expert, author and lecturer on sports architecture, Simon Inglis, has lent his support to the project:-

Are you coming on our next trip to the Crich Tramway Museum & the delightful Derbyshire Market Town of Bakewell? **Thursday, May 16**th.

"Usually when football and rugby grounds are demolished, little or no physical traces survive, so the rediscovery of remnants of Anlaby Road's Spion Kop is of genuine interest and importance in terms of our wider national sporting heritage. This is especially so, given that the 'football terrace' – that is, the mound or slope upon which millions of fans stood for their thrills, spills and companionship – represents, arguably, one of the great cultural icons of 20th Century life in Britain. So I fully support the efforts of the Hull City Supporters' **Trust** to conserve the remains of the 'Kop' as a tangible link to the past, not only for Tigers' fans but for all visitors to the modern-day MKM Stadium. The conserved terracing will serve as a lasting reminder of how different viewing conditions were for the average football fan, yet at the same time provide a poignant reminder of how much we share with our forebears. I wish the project every success and look forward to visiting this no-doubt-soon-to-be-famous venerable hump of Hull!"

MAY 2024 MEMORABILIA ARTICLE

You will read elsewhere in this Newsletter about the Hull City Supporters Trust (HCST) forming the 1906 Spion Kop Club. If you recall members of the HCST gave a presentation regarding the remaining piece of land from the old Anlaby Road football stadium at our February meeting. At the time they called it the Anlaby Road Tribute Project (ART Project). It appears things have moved on since then and they are now trying to raise money to excavate the site. They have formed the 1906 Spion Kop Club. This is a live heritage project regarding Hull City AFC.

On Thursday 18 April The Tigers Trust launched their Heritage Hub in the Tigers Trust Arena. It is a project the Senior Tigers Memorabilia Team has supported and given a great amount of help with. If you haven't visited the Arena for some time then pop in and have a look. They will be pleased to show off what they have done to date and tell you what they have planned. It should also be noted that the gathering of memorabilia and researching the club's heritage is providing the foundation for further projects to help sufferers of Dementia, Alzheimer's and Loneliness. It is planned that the Memorabilia and Gallery on the Senior Tigers website will form the basis of the material to be used in these projects.

Then on 6 June, we have our own Memorabilia and Heritage event in the Kingston Suite at the MKM Stadium. A flagship event for the Senior Tigers and the opening event of the football club's 120th Anniversary celebrations. This is a real honour for us and we are putting in great work to make it a success. We chose the first Thursday of the month (June) as it is traditionally the Senior Tigers monthly meeting day and it was in June 1904 that the club was founded. We need all of our members to support the event by visiting the stadium as if it were a usual meeting day. Entrance is free and refreshments will be available in the Raich Carter Suite. The exhibition will be open most of the day from 10.30 am with an end time to be confirmed. We would love to see you all at some point during the day.

In addition, we are looking for volunteers to help us on the day. Help is required with stewarding, greeting fans, ensuring there are no bottlenecks, general security, etc. If you can help don't hesitate to get in touch with Barbara Wilkinson or any committee member

What can you expect to see at the event? Without giving too much away you will learn a lot about the

heritage and history of the club via a Timeline. There will be information about the man considered to be the father of the modern game, who was born in Hull. Memory jogging information on the men from the Hull Daily Mail who kept us informed on club news and match reports over the years. Some before local radio and the internet gave us a closer link with the football club. There will be newspapers and scrapbooks to browse through, displays of worn shirts, programmes, magazines, footballs, books, documents, cups, trophies and much more.

TV screens will be in constant use showing films, videos, items from our web site, etc. There will be a cinema area where you can take your seat and enjoy some memories. We are expect some ex-players to pop in and be available to chat with you and answer questions.

The Tigers Trust will be doing some fundraising to help boost their funds to aid the great work they do in the community. So please support this worthy cause.
